## Biggby Coffee opens shop in Fowlerville; enjoys good start

The new Biggby Coffee in Fowlerville enjoyed a good start. The shop, located in the Country Corners Shopping Center off of South Fowlerville Road, just south of the I-96 interchange, officially opened on Jan. 17.

"Our first couple of weeks has been really good," said franchise owner Dave Roe. "We've been very busy. A lot of high school kids have come here to study in the afternoon, taking advantage of our WiFi. We have older customers who are becoming regulars. A couple of ladies bring their crocheting."

Number-wise, Roe said his shop has been selling an average of 300 cups a day, adding "that's a good number."

"A few times we were above 400, and other days 200 to 250 cups," he added.

The shop has a spacious sitting area as well as a drive-thru

window. "I'd say right now 30 to 40 percent of our trade is drive thru," said Roe. "Most of our customers are from the Fowlerville area. Once we get the freeway signs up and people know we're here, that part of the business should pick up."

The Biggby Coffee menu offers a variety of different drinks hot chocolates, crème freeze smoothies, tea lattes, and coffee lattes. Within each of those choices are different flavor options. And, noted Roe, many of the beverages can be ordered "hot, iced,

"There are 200 different drink recipes that are available," he

In addition, Biggby Coffee offers bagel sandwiches (mainly turkey and ham), muffins, donut holes, yogurt parfaits, and chocolate chip cookies.

Coffee, though, is the main draw. "Carmel Marvel, Mocha Mocha, and Teddy Bear are the most popular lattes," said Roe. "The company also features a different drink each month. Right now it's the Salted Caramel Latte while last month it was the

Peppermint Mocha."

Roe said that Biggby is testing out egg sandwiches at some of the locations, responding to numerous requests from customers. "We'll probably be serving them in six months or so," he noted.

The shop is open seven days a week. The hours are 6 a.m. to 9 p.m. Monday thru Saturday and 7 a.m. to 9 p.m. on Sunday. "Right now we have 15 employees, called barista's, who work here," Roe noted. "They're all adults and nearly all of them are from the Fowlerville area."

This is a new venture for Roe, who owns the business along with his wife, Kelly. "To prepare for the opening, I spent six weeks working at shops in Jackson and Alma to learn how to make the drinks and to see how the shops operated," he said. "Once our staff was hired, I began training them with help from the corporate office. We also had a couple of soft openings on January 12 and 13 where, for part of the day, we served free drinks.

"Training has been the hardest part so far," Roe pointed out. "Biggby Coffee has a standard which the corporate office expects us to meet, so we have needed to get our barista's up to speed as fast as possible."

The company, Roe pointed out, started as a coffee shop in East Lansing in 1995. Since then, by selling franchises and creating a standardized menu of drinks, around 350 additional stores have opened--first in Michigan and more recently in other states.

Roe, who was an Ingham County Sheriff Deputy for 25 years, starting in 1988, said he's been familiar with Biggby Coffee since it first opened in East Lansing. "I would order the Caramel Marvel latte, which is still my favorite," he said. "My wife and I had looked at this as a possible business opportunity about 10 to 12 years ago. But the timing wasn't right."

When he retired from the sheriff department in 2013 at age 47, he spent time golfing and bowling and then re-visited the idea.

"I started looking at this option in September of 2015," he said. "In deciding on where to open a shop, I wanted to be close to the freeway. We checked out different places, but this location was our best choice."

Part of the reason for that good fit was due, in part, to the space being designed initially as a coffee shop when the shopping center was built, complete with the spacious sitting area, a fireplace in the center, and the drive-thru window.

When the original coffee shop closed its doors, the space was used as a hair salon for several years. However, since that business left, the space has been vacant.

Roe said that his wife plans to help with some of the book work, but is busy with her own career.

"She is the elementary principal at Morrice Schools," he said. "She's had that position for six years. Prior to that she taught school and was a principal at Potterville."

#### ROE GREW UP IN HASLETT, GRADUATING IN 1984. He still lives in the Haslett School District with his family, their home located in the area north of Williamston.

"I worked for a Kentucky Fried Chicken outlet while in high school," he recalled. "I also played football as a tailback and nose guard and was a sprinter on the track team."

He attended Lansing Community College with the goal of becoming a paramedic. "That training is how I got hired with the sheriff department, working as an emergency medical

responder and as a deputy. Later on I was a canine handler and also spent some time in corrections and courts."

The Roes have three children: son Blake, age 19, who is attending Northern Michigan University on a football scholarship; daughter Harley, age 16, who is a sophomore at Haslett; and son Dawson, age 11, who is a sixth grader at Haslett.

Roe also coaches football. "For the past four seasons I've been an assistant with the high school program. Before that I was involved in the Youth Football League, coaching teams my son played on."

Roe, who said that he "loves to mingle and interact with people," expressed his appreciation to the Fowlerville community—both prior to and since opening the shop.

"I've been coming here off and on since I started considering the idea and began looking for a suitable location," he noted. "I've been welcomed with nothing but open arms in my dealing with people and local officials in town. Also, several of the business owners have gone out of their way to be helpful and to welcome us. I already feel part of the community and look forward to doing business here in the coming years."

## IS YOUR CHILD READY FOR KINDERGARTEN OR 1ST GRADE?

Can they sit still, listen, follow directions and get along with others?

While teaching 100's of preschoolers and kindergarteners over the last 14 years we have discovered one critical key to success for not only school but for the rest of their lives

Here is the key: Your child's first day in school is HUGE! It will pretty much dictate how they do for the rest of their academic career! If your child is ahead of her peers she will stay ahead and love school. Kids that start off behind their peers almost never catch up and like school less.

Along with falling behind they can sometimes get inaccurately "labeled" as unable to focus, hyperactive or extremely shy. We have wonderful teachers in our elementary schools but partially because of the overwhelming academic curriculum they do not have the time or resources to teach the needed basic behavioral skiils to your child. Young children really need to have these skills BEFORE they start kindergarten.

As a result we are seeing more kids struggle through kindergarten. We have talented hard working kindergarten teachers in our community but increasingly they are needing to just give their students the benefit of the doubt and pass them on to first grade hoping they succeed.

The missing skills we are talking about are centered around "Self-Regulation'

Self-regulation is the ability to monitor and manage emotions, thoughts, and behaviors. It's what helps children focus their attention on learning when they might be distracted by others, upset by a problem, or excited about an upcoming event.

When humans are first born they have little control of their reaction to their emotions and feelings. When they are hungry or uncomfortable they cry. As they get older they need to be able to regulate their response and not just react to their emotions. For example, when they get mad they cannot just hit

others. Or, when they are playing with others they may need to share when they do not want to. They may have to focus and listen while being distracted.

These skills are not just required for success in young children. Later they help teens and adults resolve conflict, problem solve, think independently, participate and get along with others.

So how do you help your child? Just copy what we do. At our school we like to use the term "accelerating their lives". We want our students to experience things at five years old that most kids do not experience until they are in high school. A good example of this is public speaking. While our students practice speaking and performing in front of a group at an early age, many kid's first experience is that speech class in high school!

Children learn by "doing" and repetition. So here is what you can do. Intentionally look for experiences that practice self-regulating skills. Things like having to listen to instructors and coaches. Handling distractions. Placed in emotional situations like getting frustrated or making a mistake. Expose them to stress, failure and hardship regularly. Working with partners and on a team. Get them involved with making decisions and making choices. Place them in situations where they have to help others and eventually in leadership positions.

Anyways I hope this helps. Like I always tell our parents "You only get one chance to start kindergarten!"





#### Two area football players sign college 'letters of intent' last week

Two area football players signed their college 'letters of intent' last Wednesday on the signing day—Bryce Bertl of Fowlerville High School and Joey Gossett of Howell High School.

Bertl is going to Northwood College in Midland. The team plays in the Division III Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletic Conference.

Bertl was a three-year starter for the Gladiators, playing on both the offensive and defensive line. He expects to play center and guard for Northwood.

In his junior and senior years, Bertl was named to the All-Conference and All-County Teams as an offensive left tackle.

Asked why he picked Northwood, he answered, "The connection I established with the coaches was one reason. Also, the college offers a major I want to pursue-Sports & Entertainment Marketing."

In addition to football, Bertl played on the Fowlerville High baseball team.

Last month, on Dec. 22, he had the opportunity to play in the All-American Bowl in Dallas, Texas on the field used by the Dallas Cowboys. The 6-foot-2, 315-pound Gladiator played most of the game on the offensive line for the East Team.

"I was the only lineman who did not have a Division One

college offer who got to see a lot of playing time," he noted. "The coach rotated us during the first three quarters, then let the best players play in the final quarter."

Bertl was among those who saw action in the final period. The West high schoolers won the game, 27-24.

Gossett, a running back, signed a letter with Mount Union College, located in Lyons, Ohio. The football team has won 12 Division III national championships and competes in the Ohio Athletic Conference.

Gossett compiled over 1,300 yards rushing and scored 19 touchdowns as a starter his junior and senior years with the Highlanders. He was named this year to the All-Conference and All-County Teams.

"I am excited to go to Mount Union with its outstanding football program, but also the college offers two academic programs I'm interested in looking at-special education and athletic training," Gossett said.

Bertl had signed his letter at the high school, but he and Gossett also wanted to have a signing ceremony at No Bull Strength Fitness Center, located south of Fowlerville on Bull Run Road. The owner-operator, Eric McKay, has been working with Bertl for the past two years and Gossett for the last twoand-a-half years. They both wanted to acknowledge his help by having the event at the premises. Members of both of the young men's families were present, along with McKay.



#### **Emmett Till 'Still Remembered'**

When I was 21, I bought a Billie Holiday album. Among the songs on it was 'Strange Fruit,' a piece Lady Day sang in a brooding, melancholy voice. Of course, as a blues singer, that could describe a lot of her offerings on this record.

I did not play the record too often and, when I did, I apparently did not listen too attentively. Eventually, it dawned on me that the lyric "Strange fruit hangin' from the poplar trees" referred to black men and women dangling from those Southern trees with ropes around their necks—the hapless victims of a lynch mob

I thought of this once-common and for many people onceacceptable form of domestic terror when I read a recent newspaper article, reporting on a new development in the longago murder of a young black man.

That young man was Emmett Till, who was 14 at the time. He was not lynched, but that might have been an easier way to go. Instead he was severely beaten, tortured if you will, before finally being shot in the head and dumped into a river. Unfortunately for his killers, fishermen found the battered body a few days later.

The incident occurred in 1955. Emmett, who was from Chicago, was visiting relatives in rural Mississippi when he allegedly made lewd remarks and sexual advances to a 21-year-old white woman, working in a grocery store. Her name at that time was Carolyn Bryant. Remarried, it's now Carolyn Donham.

The woman's then husband, Roy Bryant, and his half brother, J.W. Milam, were arrested for the murder and put on trial. Both were acquitted by the all-white, all-male jury.

Maybe the 'not guilty' verdicts were reasonable, based on the evidence presented in the trial. Maybe, as many feel, it was a travesty of justice.

The problem was that, even if the evidence pointed to their guilt "beyond a reasonable doubt," white juries in the South had a history of exonerating white men accused of killing or otherwise committing a crime against a black person. The men's acquittal—in the eyes of many blacks and sympathetic whites--seemed to fit this pattern.

In the trial, Donham (according to the article) testified that Emmett "had grabbed her, and, in profane terms, bragged about his history with white women."

A historian, Timothy B. Tyson, who has written a book "The Blood of Emmett Till" that is now on sale, told the Associated Press that "Carolyn Donham broke her long public silence in an interview with him in 2008" and admitted to him that she had given false testimony about Emmett making "physical and verbal threats."

In another interview, Tyson claimed that "She said with respect to the physical assault on her, or anything menacing or sexual, that that part isn't true."

The historical account I read indicated that the young teenager had also been accused (by Donham) of whistling at her. Other young blacks with him, including his cousin, were not sure the whistle was aimed at her or that he had done so for some other reason. His mother, later on, in questioning the claims that he'd made the threats, noted that he stuttered and had difficulty talking.

A whistle or even lewd remarks are, of course, not a capital offense. But given the social norms of Jim Crow South at that time, and in the decades before the mid-1950s, even a seemingly minor offense, a black person not showing proper deference or behaving in what was seen by whites in a surly manner, could have dire consequences—even for a 14-year-old youngster. For a number of them, the consequence was becoming "strange fruit" hanging from a tree.

According to the historian, Donham also told him, "Nothing that boy did could ever justify what happened to him."

The newspaper story recalled that the two men charged with the murder, in an interview with Look magazine not long afterwards, admitted that they'd killed the young black man.

Emmett Till's murder became a famous, landmark event, in large part, because his mother, Mamie Till Mobley, chose to have an open casket "so all the world can see what they did to my boy."

The photos of his disfigured and battered face, published in the black-owned press in Chicago and other major northern cities, caused outrage. Thousands of people filed past his casket. The trial drew lots of press coverage.

The racially-motivated murder, the details of the incident,

the trial and its outcome became a rallying cry that would galvanize the civil rights movement.

Over 60 years later, Emmett Till, and what happened to him, is still remembered. The interest that's resulted from this latest development in his case attests to the power of that memory. His life, cut short by a violent act, mattered then. It still matters.





#### **Appealing Your Property Tax Assessment**

It's that time of year again. It's time to think about your property tax assessment.

The general property tax has been an important part of our state's tax structure. Money raised goes toward financing local services, such as police and fire protection; public education; the operation of local governments; and projects such as sewers, streets, and parks. All property taxes collected by local units of government, other than the state education tax, which is sent to the state School Aid Fund for distribution, are kept locally, and no other part of that revenue is sent to or used by

Did you know that you can appeal your property tax assessment?

If, for any reason, a taxpayer disagrees with the assessed value, taxable value, or taxable status of property, he may appeal to the local governmental board of review. Township review boards meet in the week containing the second Monday in March to hear protests. Boards of Review also meet in July and in December to correct qualified errors in the roll, including adjustments for property incorrectly listed as having had a transfer of ownership or certain other errors regarding the taxable status of the property. For more information about the process of appealing your property tax assessment at the board of review, visit www.SenatorJoeHune.com to download a copy of the How To Effectively Appeal Your Property Tax Assessment guide, which has all of this information and more about the process.

If you're not satisfied with the judgment of the board of review, you may appeal the decision to the Michigan Tax

To appeal an assessment to the Michigan Tax Tribunal, an appeal must be filed on or before July 31 of the tax year involved for residential or agricultural property, and by May 31 for other property. An appeal must be filed within 35 days after the assessor, county treasurer, or county equalization director denies a claim for exemption. An appeal of a claim for a poverty exemption must be filed by June 30, if the claim was denied at the March board of review. A claim must be filed within 30 days if the July or December board of review (meetings held to correct errors in the roll) denies a claim of exemption.

An initial letter of appeal to the Michigan Tax Tribunal should be addressed to the Michigan Tax Tribunal, P.O. Box 30232, Lansing, MI 48909. The letter should state: (1) that the assessed value has been protested this year at the local board

of review (if residential or agricultural property); (2) the number of assessments that are being appealed; and (3) the location of the property by village, city, or township and county.

Transparency remains a top priority to the House this term. In January, we announced that the House website now provides easy access for the public to view the salaries of all state representatives and House staff.
